



Looking after our environment

- Don't discard anything, such as food wrappers, into the water.

- No soil, rubble or tyres in the standard waste.
- Recyclables such as glass & clothes please take home and recycle.
- If you see loose rubbish in the water or around the club collect and dispose/recycle.
- If you are last out switch off the lights.





Registration this year is via Sailevent entry form. All boats must register using the WSC Dinghy Racing 2025-26 entry form.









ETally









Sailors Responsibilities


- Sailors are reminded that the decision to go afloat is solely their own responsibility and liability and should do so with consideration for weather conditions, their own ability and the material state of their boat.
- It is the responsibility of each boat to keep a good lookout for other water users and apply both International Racing Rules for Sailing and the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (IRPCS). We do operate close to larger vessels and shipping.
- Individuals who have a medical condition that rescuers will need to be aware of in an emergency situation to make RO aware of the condition prior to racing on the day of racing.
- As we start a new season please remember the ever present risks to personal safety. Ensure
 you are dressed appropriately for the conditions and consider options to reduce risk of head
 injury from impacts such as hats or boom padding.






SIs & NoR Highlights

The usual boring (but important) stuff...

- 1. A responsible adult must supervise eTally for an under 18 and remain onsite or afloat in the race area for the duration of the event.
- 2. All helms/crews must wear a buoyancy aid while afloat.
- 3. Boats must carry a dedicated 10m x 8mm floating tow rope no shackles or carabiners.
- 4. Tell the nearest RIB or Start box if you're retiring and make sure they acknowledge.
- 5. RIBS will endeavour to attend all capsizes or boats with issues but cannot standby a single boat for extended periods as have other boats and duties to consider.
- 6. RHIB Crews must wear buoyancy aids not Lifejackets and be prepared to enter the water in an emergency.

SIs & NoR Highlights

The new and exciting stuff...



RRS Rule 41 changed so that a capsized boat may receive assistance from a Race Support Boat and continue racing.




RRS Rule 44.1 changed so that a boat may take a one turn penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of RRS Part 2 in an incident while racing.



RRS Rule A4 changed so, at the Race Officer's discretion and after the first boat has finished, boats may be awarded points according to their observed position on the course.



Starting and Finishing


- The Club line is the transit of the two yellow posts above the race hut. These line up with Pile B6. Main channel only.
- Stay clear of the start line area before your 3min.
- Recalled starts will go to the end of the sequence.
- New! Smile! You're on Candid Camera...
 - Start Sequence 3mins, 2mins, 1min, Go.
- Standard procedure for this year is that **Super Fast & Fast** then **Medium & Slow** will start together. If combined entry list for a start exceeds 20 boats, fleet starts may be separated at the discretion of the Race Officer.
 - Courses and number of laps will remain fleet specific.
 - Visual signals (Lights) as per Rule 26.
 - Strong ebb tides, once over it is a long way back!




Finishing

- 1. Normal Finish is at the Start/Finish line. Best way to get the right length race is set to many laps and shorten.
- 2. Most popular Race shortened pass this mark on the required side and proceed to the start/finish line (Flag F)

4. Race shortened - finish between the RIB and the adjacent mark of the course (Flag S)




5. Race shortened – finish on a transit through piles 6 and 7 (Both Flags S & F)






Example Course W2 (2 Laps)






- 1. No Changes to courses in 2025
- 2. The letter denotes the course, the numeral denotes the number of laps.
- 3. lowercase marks are only rounded/passed once, at the start of the course.
- 4. UPPERCASE marks are "the lap"



Carrying out Duties

- Read the notes and guides
- Arrive more than one hour before start
- RO/RIB helms must have PB2 certificate as a minimum.
- RIB crew can be temporary member (free form on website).
- RIB crew can be 16/17 if parent/guardian (18+) driver is Safety boat qualified, otherwise over 18.
- Crew Be prepared to go in the water.
- Report any defects or problems with the RIBs by email to defects@warsashsc.org.uk



Starter / Recorder

TOP TIPS

- Before start write down all boats seen in start area.
- Halsail start sequence countdown can adjust start times or sequence in prompt screen.
- During race add duty points (RDG) and check boats seen align to those signed on.
- Finish directly on tablet but be prepared to default to paper if the boats are arriving in quick succession.


